Smoke and CO2 detectors

The Rochester Fire Department received federal funding to install a limited number of smoke and carbon monoxide detectors for low income homeowners as well as in emergency situations while supplies last. Call 311 to see if you qualify.

It is the responsibility of the property owner/landlord to ensure these devices are in place, but the RFD can provide home safety checks and install prepurchased detectors upon request.

If you are renting and have any doubts about your smoke detector, contact your landlord. Non compliant landlords are referred to the NSC.



January 12 Meeting Minutes

Heather welcomed those in attendance. Self introductions around the room. Heather thanked all BNA neighbors that donated gifts to our adopted holiday family and attended our holiday party.

NOTE: Starting February 14, BNA meetings will be the <u>second</u> **TUESDAY** of each month. They will continue to be held at Johnny's from 7:00 – 8:00 pm.

Deputy Mayor Leonard Redon and Matthew McCarthy from the City of Rochester Business and Development were our guests. Deputy Mayor Redon stated this was his first invitation to a neighborhood meeting since he took office in July. He also stated that neighborhood associations are important to the texture of the city.

Discussions with the Deputy Mayor:

- •Concern that city wide litter appears to be worse than other communities
- •Litter may appear more noticeable this year because of the mild winter
- •Compliments to the city refuse collectors
- •2179 Clifford Ave gas station continues to be a problem – changes in ownership
- •Is there additional money for business/community growth?
- •Is the community development in Beechwood a success? No results yet!
- •Waring Road Project construction includes bus and bike lanes
- •MCC Board of Trustees recommendation to move from the Sibley Building to Kodak office. County Legislature is yet to approve.
- •Albany's perspective is that Rochester can take care of itself (has reserves). It

still has a strong work force. Buffalo is in receivership and Syracuse is close.

The safety report was given by Officer Brian Cannon. Crime Statistics for district PSA 26 encompasses the Culver/ Goodman/Norton area.

Just one of the Email alerts.....



snow this winter, that it is against city code to push snow from the driveway into the street! You might want to remind your contractor of this. Along the same lines, it is also against city code to obstruct the sidewalk with snow when shoveling or plowing.

The code for this is

found in Chapter 104, Article 1, Section 11D of the city code book, found on the city's website www.ecode360.com/8678574#8678621 which states:

No person shall remove snow or ice from private property or structures and deposit it on the sidewalk or roadway of any street or against a fire hydrant or on the loading or unloading areas of a public transportation system, nor shall any person authorize or permit such removal and depositing. No person shall remove snow or ice from the sidewalks and deposit it on the roadway of any street, nor shall any person authorize or permit such removal and depositing.
