

BNA September Meeting Minutes

Brian conducted the meeting in Heather's absence and welcomed all in attendance. Self introductions around the table were next. Peg asked about the status of the news video camera at 1079 Clifford and Longview, they are still in the queue.

Safety report was given by Officers Belliard and Cannon. Crime Stat comparisons today versus a year ago:

Burglaries- 27 in 2010 vs 35 in 2011 (up a bit with a spike in the last four weeks) Robberies down 38% Larcenies/petty theft- no change Aggravated Assault- down 28% Auto Theft- down 37% Murder- 1 in 2010 and none this year Rape- 2 in 201 and 3 this year

Treasurers report: \$1,300+ in the BNA bank account

Loretta C. Scott, City of Rochester Council member At-Large was in attendance. She spoke of chief Sheppard's initiative "Chief On The Street" and suggested we ask him to attend one of our meetings.

Application forms were available for "Citizen's Police Academy." Completed applications due by September 23. Training will be held on 10 consecutive Tues. 6:00 – 9:00pm in the Public Safety Training Facility on Scottsville Road.

Nancy Johns-Price NSC Administrator updated us on development in our area. Construction is to begin soon on Culver Road.

The 50/50 raffle was won by the owner of Eye Appeal and donated back to BNA, Thank you!

We have a guest speaker from the City Assessors Office for our Oct meeting. He will be accompanied by 2 associates, one to address residential concerns and the other for commercial properties.




Holiday preparations

From our President

I have gotten several replies in regard to crime info so I would like to remind everyone of a couple things.

First, there is an active neighborhood watch patrol in the form of PAC TAC, Police And Citizens Together Against Crime, that works with volunteers trained by the RPD.

Second, we have two RPD crime prevention officers who attend every one of our meetings, the second Thursday of each month at 7:00pm in the side room of Johnny's Irish Pub, 1382 Culver Road. They are available to answer questions, address specific concerns, as well as give general safety information to neighbors.

Third, only about 125 neighbors of about 600 homes in our neighborhood are on the list to receive email notices of crime reports and other related neighborhood notifications. If your neighbors aren't getting safety and crime updates they probably aren't sharing information with neighbors either. Communication is vital to crime prevention and awareness. Talk to your neighbors, encourage them to be active, observant, and to get on our mailing list.

These are 3 very important aspects of community safety, please take advantage!



Neighborhood Crimes still occurring!


