Oct Meeting Minutes

Tonights meeting was attended by Liza from RPD and Kelvin from NSC. Introductions were not needed since everyone present knew each other.

Liza started the meeting off with crime stats and said overall things were quiet. The few things that did occur were a domestic issue, a landlord/tenant issue, a possible known suspect by the homeowner and an argument that occurred in our area but the persons involved do not live here. Officers responded to "shotspotter" alerts on Goodman St and although 9 casings were found in one incident, there were no witnesses and no reported injuries.

Kelvin from NSC again told us that Goodman St from Main to Bay will be under construction for one year starting in April 2022. He said speed bumps that were put in local neighborhoods city wide were the result of federal money that was available and needed to be spent, however to the frustration of neighbors, there was no input from the public.

There were no RFD persons in attendance this month.

Treasurer's report- We currently have \$1407 in our account and no income with the only expense being for paper for our newsletters.

With elections next month the slate of officers was presented with VP still being an open position.

We are still trying to figure out how to get more neighbors to attend our meetings. Looks like ZOOM will be with us for awhile.



BNA Elections

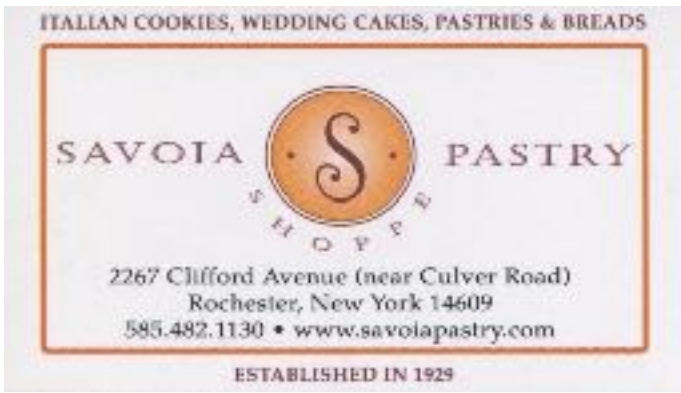
Loose Leaf Recycling
